


NOTES:

 allowed beyond those areas. All pets must have proof of shots, on a leash and accompanied by
 owner. Owners must clean up after pets! Any pets left unattended in vehicles will be reported to
 the Morton County Sheriff's Department and will be at the owner's expense. Please keep that in
 mind before you bring your pets to the fair. Exceptions: Service animals or ADA animals.




